CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

GYNAECOLOGY

I have a broad training in gynaecology. I recently reduced my clinical commitments to allow more time for research and currently do 1.5 continence clinics, 2 operating sessions and one video urodynamics programmed activities each week. In addition I do 2 community clinics, a specialist joint care of the elderly clinic and OASIS clinic per month. In 2006 I developed a programme of community gynaecology clinics; there are currently 3 of these. I run the subspecialty training programme in Urogynaecology. My Bronze CEA was renewed in 2015.

UROGYNAECOLOGY

I gained experience of Urogynaecology prior to being appointed as research fellow and subsequently as a year 4/5 SpR at Kings College Hospital. My training included undertaking a dedicated period of training equivalent to subspecialty training (prior to recognition of this post for subspecialty training).

I was employed in July 2000 as the lead clinician for Urogynaecology and subsequently director of Pelvic floor medicine at BWH a position I relinquished this after 16 years. The service is responsible for the south of Birmingham with an expanding referral service with facilities to investigate and treat patients at a tertiary level. Since January 2007 I have worked exclusively in gynaecology and predominantly Urogynaecology.

In 2003 I was accredited as a subspecialty trainer in Urogynaecology and this programme has run continuously since 2004.

I have always had an interest in training and regularly taught at undergraduate and postgraduate level.
